August 15th Solemnity – A Reminder of Mary’s Unique Role in Process of Our Salvation

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven. While this event isn’t reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church’s earliest observance. In the sixth century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, “Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne.”

4th Fatima Apparition - August 13th & 19th 1917

On **August 13th**, the Chief Magistrate had the children kidnapped, brought to his home and then the jail offices unbeknownst to their parents, and interrogated them brutally, demanding to know what secrets Our Lady had told them in July (the vision of Hell and the chastisements that would come on the world if people did not amend their lives and live according to God's design and we must pray the Rosary Daily to receive the Graces to live rightly). The Magistrate threatened to have them boiled in oil, but they remained silent and offered all this suffering for sinners. They were kept in the jail with criminals until August 15th which caused extreme suffering for these young children, ages 7, 9, and 10, but they offered all to God through Our Lady. The witnesses present at the Cova da Iria said that Our Lady came by the signs that preceded each apparition, like thunder, lightning, and a pale sun and a cool breeze, but no one saw Her.

August 19th, in a place called Valinhos, Our Lady appeared to the children; Her message states that in October I shall perform a Miracle that all may believe in my apparitions, but because of the children's kidnapping 6 days earlier the October Miracle will not be as great. Lucia, the 10 year old asked for the cure of many sick people. Our Lady said She would cure some during the year, and then with a deep sadness in Her appearance She said "Pray! Pray a great deal and make sacrifices for sinners, for many souls go to Hell for not having someone to pray and make sacrifices for them" Hell - A forgotten Dogma spoken of in Scripture often !

Some people left money and Our Lady advised the seers to use the money for processions and to help build a chapel.

St. Josaphat Kuncevych's Quatercentenary 400th Martyrdom: November 12, 1623—Josaphat's Youth (PART 1)

When John (St. Josaphat) grew up to boyhood, his parents sent him to school where he learned Polish and Slavonic languages. His fantastic natural intelligence helped him finish school quickly and with honors. The Holy Spirit helped him to memorize the entire service of the mass. When he was 10 years old, John knew all the monastic rules of the Basilian Brotherhood, the morning and evening office prayers, and would recite them from memory daily. He never once missed praying them until death closed his lips, a period of thirty years.

John was then sent by his parents from his small town of Volodymyr to work for a wealthy clothing merchant, Yakinta Popovich, in the capital city Vilno, Lithuania (today called Vilnius). The large, corrupt city was filled with moral depravity and heresies that flowed through this hub of commerce. God himself both protected St. Josaphat and counseled him to stay pure and unswayed by the worldliness around him. During this time, his greatest pleasure was to go to the Church and adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. In his free time, he poured over books of the lives of the saints and of Church Literature.

When John was 14, in 1596, an outbreak of revolt against the church united to Rome broke out and many were led astray from the true Catholic faith. This revolt was led by a faction of heretics under the rich Prince Ostrowsky, under the Byzantine Church. Prince Ostrowsky financed the operation to spread lies about the Catholic Church, misleading people under the guise of liberty and religious piety. The heretical church grew in both numbers of persons and of churches. Those faithful to Rome became small and retained only one single church, the church of the Holy Trinity and were referred to as Uniates. Growing up during these controversies required John to have strength and exercise prudence to keep peace in his soul and preserve the balance of kindness and justice with those he was in daily contact with.

Introductory Meeting –Pillar Committees for our Parish Family - Wed., Aug. 9, 7 PM - OLHC

We have reached the next step along the Road to Renewal for our Family of Parishes, and now that the bishop has named Fr. Jozef, Fr. Lou and Fr. Marcin into leadership positions, it is time to form the discussion groups (called pillars) which will set the plan for our journey moving forward. Here are the pillar names and their tasks:

- 1) Administration Pillar – deals with "set-up" of the family - communication methods, parish planning, staffing, financing, family goals
- 2) Forming Disciples Pillar – how to provide best means of Bible/religious instruction (Faith Formation)
- 3) Liturgy Pillar – what does the family have in place currently as a Mass/liturgical/sacramental schedule and what do we need it to look like in the future
- 4) Outreach/Inreach Pillar – what ministries (both within the family and out into the community) are currently in place and how do we reach those we need to connect (or reconnect) with
- 5) Spiritual Life Pillar – what spiritual devotions are in place (other than Masses) and how do they need to be scheduled
- 6) Stewardship Pillar – how do we motivate parishioners' time, talents and treasure for the betterment of the entire family (get people personally involved; not just about finances)

Each of the 4 parishes is asked to choose two representatives for each pillar, so there will be 8 people per pillar group to set up an action plan for the family. If there is a group that you think you would be able to assist with and which interests you, you are invited to an introductory meeting on **Wed., Aug. 9 at 7 PM** in the lower hall at Our Lady Help of Christians (elevator is available). Each pillar group will make its own schedule for meetings for the next 6 months (approximately).

If you know of a parishioner who would be especially talented to assist with a particular group, feel free to speak to them and encourage them to offer their time for this project – bring a friend to this meeting and learn more about it. The input provided by the parishioners within our family will be crucial in planning for the success of this venture. We ask each family member to pray for its success.

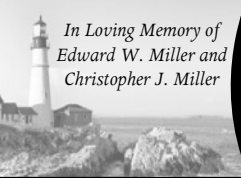

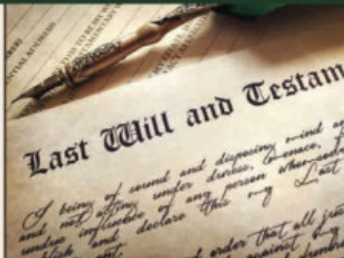
