Faith Formation: Every child and youth need to be educated and continue to grow in faith by the help of parents, family members, and Church. Please call (716) 458-3071 to register your child for the Religious Education program.

Confessions: Our priests are available to administer this important sacrament of mercy 20 min. before every daily and vigil Masses. Also, call the office for a personal appointment. Every Catholic needs to go to confession at least once a year. Holy communion can be received during the Mass only in the state of grace (without mortal sin).

Marriage: The sacrament for women and men in love that want to create a new Christian family together and with God. All couples who are choosing to serve the Church through the vocation of marriage are invited to schedule the ceremony at least 6 months before the wedding day.

Anointing of the sick: We administer the sacrament every Tuesday, after 12 pm Mass at Resurrection Church. Also, call us to request a home or hospital visit. Please do not postpone contacting a priest at the very moment of death but request the sacrament when the sick person is still conscious and aware of the approaching final journey.

Funerals: Please arrange with the funeral home of your choice. They will contact our Church for you to schedule this very important liturgical celebration for our beloved departed.

R.C.I.A.: The program of Christian initiation to become a member of the Catholic Church. Please contact us if called by the holy spirit.

New Parishioners: Always welcome to register and support us through time, talent, and treasure. Registration Forms are available in the back of our Churches. Please visit or contact our office to register or notify us when moving out of the Parish.

Letter of Recommendation: These are testimonies to the fact that you are a practicing Catholic in the Parish. Please use contribution envelopes to indicate attendance. To be a sponsor, a person needs to be confirmed, registered at our Parish, and attending Holy Mass at our Church. Interested in Becoming Catholic?

The journey towards becoming a full member of the Catholic Church includes time for prayer, catechesis, and conversation. St. Josaphat Kuncevych's Quatercentenary 400th Martyrdom: November 12, 1623 - St. Josephat the Monk

The state of the monasteries in the Ukraine were in desperate need of renewal. John (Josaphat) wanted to give back to God all that he had received, his heart, mind, strength, ability as reflected through his personal radiance. God sent John to renew the monastery to its previous glory.

Members of monastic orders, monks, dedicate their lives chiefly to prayer, contemplation, and mortification of the flesh all done for the salvation of souls. Some monks give retreats, teach, publish books, write newspapers, offer masses and lead in deeds of mercy for the spiritual and physical uplifting of God's people. And John did all of these as a monk.

The Eastern Church had a custom that only monks could become bishops. The monk must be a good monk, completely detached from self, filled with zeal and virtue, responsive to the needs of his people, then he would be a worthy candidate for bishop. This was all part of God's mission for John later in his life. (Continued with next bulletin.)


