December 10th—OLHC Winter Bazaar—10:30 am—3:00 pm in the OLHC Parish Hall. (more details to follow)

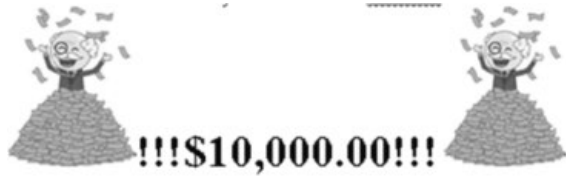

### PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR THE SOULS IN Purgatory (November 1-8)

This is how an indulgence is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471): "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".

-To gain indulgences, whether plenary or partial, it is necessary that the faithful be in the state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.

-A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace: 1) have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; 2) have sacramentally confessed their sins; 3) receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required); 4) pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff. It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

-Indulgences can always be applied either to one-self or to the souls of the deceased, but they can-not be applied to other persons living on earth.

**-A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted each and every day from Nov 1 to Nov 8, who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed.**

### RCIA Program for All 3 Parishes

The RCIA program is for those who want to belong or return to the Catholic Church. Please contact the OLHC Parish office if you want to receive the Sacraments. We will provide classes for this program after the Christmas season. The Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion will be celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass on **Saturday, April 8th 2023**. If you have not made your Confirmation, or left the Catholic Church for a long time, please come to our church for RCIA. If your marriage has not been Blessed sacramentally in the Catholic Church, please contact us to discuss your options and how to accomplish this. All candidates of RCIA are asked to attend Mass every Sunday and learn about faith. Please register for the program by calling the OLHC Parish office or email [olhc.chapel@gmail.com](mailto:olhc.chapel@gmail.com) or [ksdudzik@gmail.com](mailto:ksdudzik@gmail.com).
