- 2. One hour of the Blessed Sacrament Adoration on Mondays between 9 am to 6 pm in our OLHC Chapel.
- 3. Come to Confession before Christmas (necessary to everyone).
- 4. Create your Family Advent wreath at home. Say prayer with Family members before dinner every night.
- 5. Request Holy Mass intention for a family member who has passed away or is sick.
- 6. Every Friday of Advent practice fast from meat, less use of the internet or tv, more reading of Bible.
- 7. Ask Father if he needs you to volunteer in our parish for one hour a week.
- 8. Help your lonely or older neighbors with shopping or house cleaning, invite somebody who is alone for Christmas dinner to your home.
- 9. Decide to attend every Sunday the Holy Mass in our church. Start going to Church regularly.
- 10. If you are married decide with your spouse to not argue anymore, to not use bad language, to work on your marriage vocation.

Brothers and Sisters. These 10 may teach us true Christian life and engaging into prayer and faith. All of them are going to improve our faith, our spirit and joy for life.

ADVENT WREATH

The lights of the candles on the Advent Wreath break through the darkness, reminding us of the Light of Christ that we anticipate during this holy season.

In the middle ages, the Germanic peoples began incorporating a lighted wreath into the Christian season of Advent. It didn't gain widespread popularity until the 1800s and it wasn't until the 1900s that German immigrants brought the tradition to America.

The Advent Wreath is very symbolic. The evergreens used for the wreath itself are a reminder of continuous life. The shaping of them into a circle reinforces that meaning. The circle is also a sign of everlasting life as well as the eternity of God.

The four candles used, three purple and one pink, mark the Sundays of Advent before Christmas. The purple candles are reminders that this should be a time of prayer and sacrifice to prepare us for the second coming of Christ. On the third Sunday, the pink candle is lit to announce Gaudete Sunday, a Sunday of rejoicing for Christ is coming near. With the lighting of that candle, the light has won out over the darkness.

The Advent Wreath serves as a powerful visual reminder of the holiness of the season. The light of the candles invite us to quiet ourselves during this busy time and reflect on the true meaning of Christmas. Whether at home or at Church, it provides an invitation to wait and pray in hopeful anticipation for the coming of Christ. We are called to welcome the light of Christ into our lives.

Message to Latin Mass Parishioners - from Fr. Jozef

Dear Parishioners: Again, on Sunday, the 13th of November you did not participate in the Holy Eucharist that is the heart of every Sunday and Holy Day. This is the second time since I have been Pastor of OLHC parish. It was the greatest pain of heart I have ever experienced hearing about you leaving our Church without Sunday Eucharist when Fr Marcin or myself were available to celebrate for you.

When one of the priests praying the Latin Rite Mass is not available because of an emergency, Fr. Marcin and I are always here for you. We are your priests. We love that we experience the venerable Old Rite of Eucharist every Sunday but in an emergency situation each one of you should stay for The Holy Mass of New Rite of the same Eucharist that we receive in Catholic Church. If anyone would deny to participate in The Rite of Mass that was established by the Church after the Second Vatican Counsel when Old Rite is not available would commit the mortal sin, and put his/her soul outside of the Holy Church.

We can always celebrate for you in such an emergency situation and if anyone has true catholic faith and spirituality should accept it with joy and appreciate the same fruits of salvation we receive in the One and the Same Holy Eucharist ever.

I want to assure you that I will cancel our Latin Mass that I love so much as a Catholic priest if next time such a situation will happen and you would leave church and not stay for the Eucharist celebrated by Fr Marcin or myself.

We can celebrate for you in Latin also or English or Polish (language doesn't matter) the Passion and Resurrection of our Lord. You will be able to receive the Body of Christ kneeling and into mouth that is the first form of receiving Jesus in every Eucharist Latin or English as well.

Please think about it and pray deeply about your catholic faith. If anyone would disagree with it such a person commits serious sin of disbelief that needs to be quickly confessed with sincere repentance.

We always will form your souls in true catholic Spirit so that everyone who belongs to our Catholic Parish will go to heaven in the future.

With love and pastoral care, I am writing this for you. I couldn't sleep or eat because my people last Sunday were asked to leave our Church without the Bread of Life. The greatest possible failure of our pastoral life. I hope the Merciful God will forgive us all. Always praying for you and admiring your deep faith. I will defend our Latin Mass to continue to be celebrated but only for you who understand everything in the true and Catholic way.

The month of December is rich with celebrations and Feast days. On December 8th we honor the Feast Day of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. December 12th is Our Lady of Guadalupe. Advent takes center stage with our count down to the Nativity of our Lord Jesus. An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles that are lighted successively in the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought into the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. A rose-colored candle is used to mark the Third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Children love the beauty of the simple traditional ceremony. Lighting candles in an Advent Wreath is a simple way to start a tradition of family worship in the home. Those who participate will cherish the experience all their lives.

BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

It starts at the evening meal on the Saturday before the first Sunday in Advent with the blessing of the wreath. A leader can be the head of household or you can choose a leader. The following prayer can be used.

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Your abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water. Then follows the prayer which is said before the evening meal each night of the first week in Advent.

FIRST WEEK The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. After the prayer, the family's youngest child lights the first purple candle. (Family members can also take turns lighting and blowing out the candles on each night.)


Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, That by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.
